











Q5 How would you describe the area you live in?







Q7 Do you support pill testing programs at music events and fixed sites?















Q13 Do you support the introduction of prescribed heroin (also known as heroin assisted treatment)?





Q14 Do you understand the system for people to access medicinal cannabis?





Q15 Do you support the continued prohibition of any of these drugs? (More than one response can be provided)












